# Covid-19 Update

As you will be aware, the Government have had to begin tightening Covid-19 rules across the country in response to the new Omicron variant which has arisen in the past few weeks. We have been informed this week that the plan moving forward for schools to address the issue is as follows:

From Tuesday 14 December, people who are fully vaccinated and identified as a contact of someone with COVID-19 – whether Omicron or not – should take an NHS rapid lateral flow test every day for 7 days to help slow the spread of COVID-19.

Daily rapid testing applies to all contacts who are:

- fully vaccinated adults people who have had 2 jabs
- all children aged 5 to 18 years and 6 months, regardless of their vaccination status
- people who can prove they are unable to be vaccinated for clinical reasons

Under 5s are exempt from self-isolation and do not need to take part in daily rapid lateral flow testing.

Whilst I understand that this may be difficult for parents in terms of administering LFT tests to primary age children, as well as the difficulties in accessing tests in the first place, this is the guidance we have to follow and we would ask that you support us in following these rules in the coming weeks after Christmas.

On another note, as a Trust, we have recently sought parents' opinions as to how our schools are performing. Whilst feedback was very positive, we are aware of the need to invite parents into school more and to provide them with a greater understanding of their child's performance. Whilst the Covid-19 crisis has largely meant that we have had to restrict access and opportunities for parents to come into school and feel part of the community, we would like to focus on this key area and try to provide more opportunities for parents to engage with our schools. However, as you can all understand, we have had to fit in with Covid-19 regulations at all times over the past 18 months and will need to continue to do so in the coming months also. The new variant may hamper our plans to further improve in this area, but we will do everything we can to get parents and carers into schools when it safe to do so.

### **Exciting Upcoming Events**

As a Trust, we are lucky to be able to run a number of cross-Trust events which we hope will be exciting for our children and give them opportunities to do things they may not ordinarily be able to do. This year, we are planning a number of exciting activities in terms of PE and IT, and we are also stepping up our work with Unilever, who will be running a MAT-wide competition during the first few weeks of January across our schools. We have also organised a MAT show in May at the Floral Pavilion for Year 4 children to take part in, and will be working with a composer in February to create a MAT song. I will keep you up to date with any further events in the coming weeks.

### **OFSTED Reports**

I must pay tribute to the staff at Poulton Lancelyn and Stanton Road for their recent OFSTED inspection reports. Two of the founding schools for the Trust, the reports highlight their fabulous practice and how well they are performing under the new OFSTED framework, which focuses primarily on the quality of education given by the schools. In both cases, inspectors were impressed by the quality of education being provided and by the enthusiastic attitudes of the pupils. The reports have now been sent to

parents and are available on the OFSTED website. Well done to all the staff at both schools who do an amazing job each and every day for their children. We really appreciate you all!

# **Black History Month**

In October our schools worked together in celebration of Black History Month. Each school displayed a mural of Martin Luther King based on his famous 'I have a dream' speech which the children added to with their own dreams for the future. The children have also been studying the lives of significant people in history, including Katherine Johnson, whose mathematical skills helped NASA put an astronaut into space and Walter Tull, a British Army officer of Afro-Caribbean descent.
