Impact (2014-2015)

Out of Hours Clubs

By employing a sports apprentice, and as a result of partnerships with Premier Sports and Bebington High Sports College, the school has been able to offer consistently throughout the year a wide variety of sports clubs this year. These have included football clubs for boys and girls, netball, handball, basketball, hockey, tennis, cheerleading, Judo, Multi-Skills and Street Dance.

Competitions

The school once again took part in a wide variety of competitions during the year. These included:

- * Inter-school football matches
- * 7 a side football competition (BHSC)
- * Girls football tournament (Weatherhead)
- * Basketball (BHSC)
- * Hockey

Quality of Teaching and CPD

Staff have continued to benefit from specialist PE teacher support offered by local schools. The school purchased one hour a week of support from BHSC to offer CPD in gymnastics and dance, while children in Y3 and Y4 attended PE lessons at WGSG on a weekly basis. All staff attended a Basketball INSET session at BHSC.

Sports Apprentice

Employing a sports apprentice has helped to raise the profile of PE in a number of ways during the year. This has enabled us to: * Increase the number of OHSC on offer to the children.

- * Develop a lunchtime play-leaders programme to promote participation in physical activity.
- * Offer teachers assistance and children additional specialist coaching during PE lessons
- * Increase participation in inter-school competitions.
